WHY IT MATTERS

Arguments, punishments and family conflict can generate dramatic content, but broadcasting these events exposes children to public judgment and turns private problems into permanent entertainment. It can also make healthy conflict resolution more difficult when an audience is involved.

TURN THE CAMERA OFF

Conflict needs resolution, not an audience.

NEVER FILM PUNISHMENTS

Discipline should remain private.

A child's distress should never become a dramatic episode.

DON'T CREATE CLICKBAIT FROM PAIN

Personal conflict isn't a marketing asset.

KEEP ADULT DISPUTES AWAY

Children shouldn't be drawn into relationship drama for content.

DON'T ASK VIEWERS TO TAKE SIDES

Audience judgment can intensify family divisions.

RESOLVE PROBLEMS PRIVATELY

Healthy families need space to disagree without public scrutiny.

DON'T REPLAY CONFLICT

Staging arguments can distort real relationships.

PROTECT EVERYONE'S REPUTATION

One heated moment shouldn't become a permanent online identity.

MODEL HEALTHY BOUNDARIES

Family disagreements should remain family matters.

Family conflict needs communication and privacy, not thumbnails, spectators and a comment section.
