

REVEALING THE LAYOUT OF THE FAMILY HOME



WHY IT MATTERS

Years of filming inside a family home can unintentionally provide viewers with a detailed understanding of its layout, entrances, bedrooms, valuables and security arrangements. Combined with identifying location information, this can create privacy and security concerns.



1 AVOID COMPLETE HOUSE TOURS

Don't provide strangers with a virtual walkthrough of the property.

2 KEEP CHILDREN'S BEDROOMS PRIVATE

The audience doesn't need to know exactly where children sleep.

3 DON'T SHOW EVERY ENTRANCE

Doors, gates and side access points are security information.

4 PROTECT ALARM DETAILS

Don't demonstrate how the home's security system works.

5 WATCH WINDOW VIEWS

Exterior landmarks can help identify the property.

6 DON'T DISPLAY VALUABLE LOCATIONS

Avoid showing where expensive items are routinely stored.

7 USE CONTROLLED FILMING AREAS

A small neutral background exposes far less information.

8 REVIEW OLD HOUSE CONTENT

Years of uploads may collectively create a virtual floor plan.

9 CREATE PERMANENT NO-FILM AREAS

Some rooms should simply never appear online.

10 THINK LIKE AN UNINVITED VIEWER

Ask what someone could learn about entering or navigating the home from the footage.

BOTTOM LINE

Your home should be your child's private safe space, not a publicly searchable floor plan.
