



Routine Exposure Making a Child Easier to Track

WHY IT MATTERS

Repeated family content can reveal predictable patterns: the same school run, the same park, the same club on the same evening. Over time, viewers may be able to infer where a child is likely to be even when no current location has been explicitly posted.

SCHOOL RUN

route + time

+

REGULAR PARK

place + day

+

WEEKLY CLUB

location + hour



COMBINED POSTS REVEAL A PATTERN

Separate clues can become a route map, timetable and prediction of where a child may be next.



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PRACTICAL SAFEGUARDS - POINTS 1-5

DON'T POST THE SCHOOL RUN

Regular journeys can expose recurring times and routes.

2

KEEP WEEKLY CLUBS PRIVATE

A recurring activity creates a predictable location.

3

AVOID ROUTINE-BASED SERIES

"Every Tuesday" content can teach strangers the family's timetable.

4

DELAY POSTS

Publish after leaving rather than while a child is still there.

5

REMOVE IDENTIFYING BACKGROUNDS

Landmarks can reveal frequently visited locations.

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PRACTICAL SAFEGUARDS - POINTS 6-10

DON'T SHARE PICK-UP TIMES

Even approximate schedules can create useful patterns.

7

KEEP REGULAR PARKS PRIVATE

Repeated visits can reveal where a child is likely to be.

8

WATCH WHAT CHILDREN SAY ON CAMERA

Casual comments can expose future plans.

9

REVIEW CONTENT AS A WHOLE

A routine may only become obvious when multiple videos are viewed together.

10

ASK THE PREDICTABILITY QUESTION

Could a stranger reasonably guess where the child will be tomorrow?

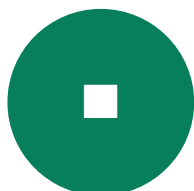
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BOTTOM LINE

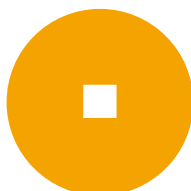
Repeated routines turn ordinary family content into a timetable.

BREAK THE PATTERN BEFORE IT BECOMES A PREDICTION



VARY

Avoid publishing recurring routes.



DELAY

Post only after leaving.



REVIEW

Look at uploads collectively.
